

PREREQUISITE REQUIREMENT

There are three prerequisites for attending Wood Badge:

- 1) You must be registered with BSA.
- 2) You must have completed Basic Training for your registered Scouting position..
- 3) A current medical examination on a BSA form is required prior to participation.

COST

The cost to attend this two-session course is \$225. This includes all camping fees meals, notebooks and training material required for the course. Uniform, tent and personal equipment are provided by the participant.

WHAT DO I DO?

Start making your plans now to attend Wood Badge in 2009! Become another adult who thinks being trained is the right thing to do, for yourself and for the youth you train.

Submit a \$50 deposit to hold your spot. Checks are made payable to BAC BSA.

I understand that this deposit will be applied to full course fee and is non-refundable (unless I'm placed on a waiting list.) I am not guaranteed a spot unless paid in full by August 1, 2009.



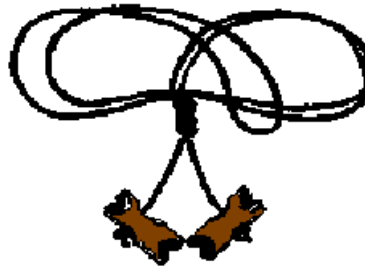

WOOD BADGE TICKET

The purpose of the Wood Badge experience is to strengthen Scouting in our units, our districts, and our councils. The Wood Badge “ticket” represents each participants commitment to complete a set of personal goals relating to that individual’s Scouting position. These goals will significantly strengthen the program in which the participant is involved.

In addition, the ticket gives participants an opportunity to practice and demonstrate a working knowledge of the leadership skills presented during the course. Participants should complete their Wood Badge ticket no later than 18 months after the course.

RECOGNITION

Upon completion of the Wood Badge ticket, as certified by a ticket counselor and the participant, the participant will be presented with the Wood Badge certificate, neckerchief, woggle and beads at the appropriate ceremony.
